ORDINANCE NO. 2737

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF WARRENTON, CLATSOP COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON, ON TUESDAY, JUNE 21, 1949, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS (ELECTORS) OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON A PROPOSAL TO EXCEED THE SIX PERCENT TAX LIMITATION, FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION, AND PROVIDING THE TIME, MANNER AND METHOD OF HOLDING SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there be and there is hereby ordered and ordained to be held in the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, State of Oregon, a special election of the legal voters (electors) thereon, on Tuesday, the 21st day of June, 1949, at which election there shall be submitted to the legal voters (electors) of the City of Warrenton for their approval or rejection, the following proposition, to-wit:

"Shall the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, State of Oregon, be permitted to exceed the constitutional six per cent tax limitation as provided for in Section 2, Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon by the sum of \$7,536.90."

Section 2. That the poll for said special election shall be open for said special election at the hour of eight o'clock A.M., and remain open until the hour of eight o'clock P.M. on the day of such special election.

Section 3. The following designated place is hereby established as the polling precinct and voting place, and the following named persons are hereby appointed as Judges and Clerks of said polling place for said special election, to-wit:

(A) The entire City of Warrenton shall consist of one precinct and the voting place of said precinct shall be at the City Hall of the City of Warrenton.

Section 4. That said question or proposition contained in Section 1 hereof be placed upon the official ballot by the Auditor and Police Judge and in compliance with the Charter of the City of Warrenton and laws and ordinances governing elections concerning municipal affairs at elections held at the time of a general state election.

Section 5. At such special election all electors of the City of Warrenton duly registered as by law now provided shall be entitled to vote upon the proposed proposition submitted by the terms of said ordinance.

Section 6. That the Auditor and Police Judge of the City of Warrenton shall at least Twenty (20) days prior to the time when said special election is to be held, cause notice thereof to be given to the legal voters (electors) of the City of Warrenton, by posting not less than three (3) notices in each precinct of the City of Warrenton announcing the passage of this Ordinance, and stating the time and place when said special election shall be held, the names of the Judges and Clerks of said special election, polling places designated therefore, and setting forth the proposition to be voted upon at saidspecial election, which said notices shall be posted in conspicuous places in each precinct in the City of Warrenton and setting forth that said special election is to be held at the time and in the polling places herein designated.

Section 7. At such special election the affirmative of said proposition as set forth in Section 1 hereof shall be numbered on the official ballot thereof as 300 and the negative number 301 in numerals.

Section 8. The provisions of this ordinance are directive only, and substantial compliance with the spirit and intent thereof shall be sufficient.

Section 9. All ordinances or sections of ordinances previously adopted hereto and in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 10. EMERGENCY. Inasmuch as the financial condition of the City of Warrenton is in serious condition and that it is imperative that such additional funds be provided, if possible, and it is deemed advisable, expedient and necessary that this ordinance take effect as soon as possible so that the welfare, health, peace, safety and financial security of the people of the City of Warrenton be safeguarded and preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall therefore be in full force and operative immediately after its passage by the Commissioners of the City of Warrenton and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
