

AN ORDINANCE standardizing the construction of sidewalks in the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, Oregon, and declaring an emergency.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all sidewalks constructed in the City of Warrenton shall be constructed of either wood or cement, and shall conform to the following specifications, to-wit:

When constructed of wood the sidewalk shall be six feet wide, built with two 8" x 6" S/D planks laid upon three 3" x 6" stringers, on size to be specified mud sills, to be specified the said surface planks to be fastened to the said stringers by 20 penny nails; and

When constructed of concrete or cement it shall be laid upon a base of rock and cement four inches thick, and the surface shall be one half inches thick laid upon top of the base, and shall be six feet wide, and built so as to conform to the established grade.

Section 2. Inasmuch as the objects to be obtained by this ordinance will be of great benefit to the people of the City of Warrenton and there exists and is an urgent necessity that this ordinance should take effect as soon as possible, so that the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this section, therefore, shall take effect when approved by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Common Council, and this ordinance shall then be in full force and operative immediately after its approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
