

AN ORDINANCE, PRESCRIBING THE SALARIES OF THE CITY ATTORNEY, AUDITOR AND POLICE JUDGE, MARSHALL, DYKE SUPERINTENDENT, AND CITY ENGINEER, RESPECTIVELY, FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS FROM JANUARY 1, 1921, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That for a period of two years, beginning January 1, 1921,

(a) The salary or retainer of the City Attorney shall be \$75.00 per month, payable monthly, plus traveling and hotel expenses when required to perform his duties, as such City Attorney, outside of his office in Astoria, Oregon, or elsewhere <sup>in his office</sup> it may be in Clatsop County, Oregon; provided, however, that in addition thereto, whenever it shall be necessary for the City of Warrenton to be represented in any court (except the Municipal Court of Warrenton), said City Attorney shall then and there represent and appear in behalf of the City and receive for such services, in addition to the aforesaid compensation, the usual fee paid to attorneys (in absence of a retainer) for such services;

(b) The salary of the Auditor and Police Judge shall be \$ 125<sup>00</sup> per month, payable monthly;

(c) The salary of the City Marshal shall be \$ 100<sup>00</sup> per month, payable monthly; *provided that the City Marshal perform the duties of janitor at the City Hall in addition to the duties of Marshal*

(d) The salary of the Dyke Superintendent shall be \$ 165<sup>00</sup> per month, payable monthly; and

(e) ~~The salary of the City Engineer shall be \$ \_\_\_\_\_ per month, payable monthly.~~

Section 2. That the enactment of this ordinance at this time, and the taking effect of the same forthwith, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.

Section 3. That all ordinances, and parts of ordinances, in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on the 15th day of January, A. D. 1921.
