

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE IMPROVEMENT OF A PORTION OF ELM STREET, AND A PORTION OF FIRST STREET IN WARRENTON, BY LAYING A STANDARD WOOD SIDE-WALK ALONG THE SAME, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The Common Council, by a resolution duly adopted on February 15, 1921, declared its intention to improve the following described portions of Elm Street and of First Street in the City of Warrenton:

Beginning at a point where the said Elm Street intersects the South boundary of Second Street, thence North on and along the West side of said Elm Street to its intersection with the South boundary of First Street, thence East on and along the South side of First Street to the Westerly boundary of the right of way of the S.P. & S. Railway Co.;-- should be improved by laying and constructing a standard wood side-walk, including the usual cross-walks at street intersections, in pursuance of a petition therefor which had theretofore been duly filed with the Council, praying that said improvement be so made; and

WHEREAS, Notice of the Council's intention to so make said improvement has been duly published in the Warrenton News, in pursuance of § 50 of the last Amended Charter of the City of Warrenton; and

WHEREAS, The time for filing remonstrance against said improvement having elapsed, and no remonstrance whatsoever having been made or filed against said proposed improvement; and

WHEREAS, The Council in said resolution directed and caused estimates of the cost of said proposed improvement, and specifications for the same, to be made, and deposited with the Auditor and Police Judge of said City, all of which has heretofore accordingly been done; Now, therefore,

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the portions of Elm Street and of First Street, respectively, described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the said Elm Street intersects the South boundary of Second Street, thence North on and along the West side of said Elm Street to its intersection with the South boundary of First Street, thence East on and along the South side of First Street to the Westerly boundary of the right of way of the S.P. & S. Railway Co.;-- be, and the same is hereby, directed to be improved by laying and constructing a standard wood side-walk, including usual cross-walks at street intersections, such walk being more particularly described as follows:

*3-3"x6" Stringers with mud sills 3"x8"-8ft apart with 2"x8"x6" Decking S/S/E laid Roughside up nailed with 20D nails. Crosswalks to be in center of street, 24 feet wide of 8-3"x12" Decking with 9-4"x6" Stringers, nailed with 60D nails. "note" Lot 5/2ER 122 is excepted from this ordinance*

along the above described portions of said streets, all in accordance with said specifications and said resolution, declaring the Council's intention to make such proposed improvement.

Section 2. That the Auditor and Police Judge be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to call for bids for the making of said proposed improvement, in the manner aforesaid, by publishing the same in two successive issues of the Warrenton News, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Warrenton.


Section 3. That upon said bids being received and opened at the time and place stated in said call, by the Streets and Public Highways Committee, such Committee is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract, in behalf of the City, for the making of said proposed improvement with the lowest responsible bidder therefor, if in such Committee's discretion any one of said bids should be accepted, and if all of said bids received in pursuance of said call should, in the opinion of said Committee, be rejected, or if no bids be received, then the Auditor and Police Judge is hereby authorized and directed to pub-



lish another call for bids, in the manner and for the time herein required for the first call of said bids, the same authority being given to said Committee to open the second bids and enter into a contract for said proposed improvement in the manner hereinbefore stated.

Section 4. That the enactment of this ordinance at this time, and the taking effect of the same forthwith, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
