

AN ORDINANCE, PROHIBITING THROWING GLASS, TIN CANS, BOARDS, CHUNKS OF WOOD, SAW DUST, BALLAST OR OTHER RUBBISH IN AND UPON THE STREETS, PUBLIC WAYS, DITCHES, RIVERS AND CREEKS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON, AND PROVIDING PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Any person who shall throw or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited, in, or upon, any street, highway, sidewalk or other public way, or in or upon any ditch, drain, creek, river or other water-way, any glass, ~~paper, carcass, or any dead animal,~~ nails, tacks, tin cans, boards, chunks of wood, saw-dust, rocks, ballast, (other than may be used in constructing and repairing said public ways and water courses, etc.), or other rubbish of any and all kinds whatsoever, including all kinds of oil, coal tar, bitulithic, gasoline, etc., in said water-ways and drains, within the corporate limits of the City of Warrenton, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, in the police court, shall be ~~punished~~ ^{fine} not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$500.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail not to exceed 100 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the sound discretion of the Auditor and Police Judge.
