

AN ORDINANCE, AUTHORIZING THE IMPROVEMENT OF PARTS OF RAILWAY AVENUE, THIRD STREET, ELM STREET, WALNUT STREET, AND ASH STREET, AS PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED IN THIS ORDINANCE, BY GRADING ALONG THE CENTER THEREOF FOR THE WIDTH OF 18 FEET, AND BY MACADAMIZING ALONG THE CENTER THEREOF FOR THE WIDTH OF 12 FEET TO A DEPTH OF 8 INCHES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. That, in pursuance of the Council's declaration of intention to improve, and notice of such intention duly given in accordance with said declaration, it is hereby ordained that the following described portions of streets, to-wit: Railway Avenue, from its intersection with the Westerly boundary of the pavement now on Main Street, in said City; thence Southerly, along the center of said Railway Avenue, to its intersection with Third Street; thence Westerly, along the center of Third Street to its intersection with the center of Ash Street; thence Northerly, along the center of Ash Street, to its intersection with the center line of Second Street; - Also Walnut Street, from its intersection with Third Street; thence Northerly, along the center of Walnut Street, to its intersection with the center line of First Street; - Also Elm Street, from its intersection with the center of Third Street; thence Southerly, along the center of Elm Street, to the center line of Fourth Street; -- be improved By grading such portions of said streets for a width of eighteen (18) feet, along the center of each thereof, and macadamizing the same for a width of twelve (12) feet along the center thereof, such macadam to be eight (8) inches in depth; all in accordance with said declaration, said notice, and the plans and specifications therefor, now on file in the office of the Auditor and Police Judge of said City.

Section 2. That the Auditor and Police Judge be, and he hereby is authorized and directed to call for bids for the making of said proposed improvement, in the manner aforesaid, by publishing the same in two successive issues of the weekly newspaper, The Warrenton News, published in, and of general circulation in, said City of Warrenton.

Section 3. That upon said bids being received and opened, either by the Common Council, sitting as a Committee of the Whole, or by the Committee on Streets and Public Highways, at the time and place stated in said call for bids, such Committee, or any other person or persons, whom the Council may hereafter authorize, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract, for the making of said proposed improvement, if, in the discretion of either of such committees, thus considering said ~~it~~ bids, any of said bids should be accepted, and if all of the bids received in pursuance of said call should, in the judgment of such committee, be rejected, or if no bids be received, then, the Auditor and Police Judge is hereby authorized and directed to publish another call for bids, in the manner, and for the time herein required, for the first call for ~~xx~~ said bids, the same authority being hereby given the said committee to open the second bids and enter into a contract for the making of said proposed improvement, in the manner hereinbefore stated, and other bids may be called for in a like manner, so long as the Council or committee, rejecting the bids may by its motion so order.

Section 4. That, since said proposed improvement can be advantageously done only during the few summer months, and such improvement is absolutely necessary for use by the inhabitants in said proposed improvement district, - the enactment of this ordinance at this time, and the taking effect of same forthwith, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and an emergency is, therefore, hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.

Section 5. That the time for remonstrating against said proposed improvement has elapsed, and ~~no~~ remonstrance thereto has been filed by ~~any person whomsoever~~, *Smiley-Lampert Lumber Company, a corporation stating it owned 22 lots in said improvement district. Upon consideration of the remonstrance, the Council approved, and rejected said remonstrance, and directed that said* ~~said~~ *proceeded with immediately as herein provided.*
