

AN ORDINANCE, AUTHORIZING THE IMPROVEMENT OF FOURTH STREET, BY GRADING ALONG THE CENTER THEREOF FOR THE WIDTH OF 18 FEET, AND BY MACADAMIZING THE SAME, ALONG THE CENTER THEREOF, FOR THE WIDTH OF TWELVE FEET, AND TO A DEPTH OF EIGHT INCHES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the portion of Fourth Street, in that part of the City of Warrenton, Oregon, which was platted by D.K. Warren as *Warrenton Addition to Astoria in Warrenton* Addition, which portion of said street is described as follows: Beginning at the point where said Fourth Street intersects the Westerly boundary of the pavement now on Main Street in said addition; thence running Westerly along the center of said Fourth Street, to its intersection with the center line of Cedar Street in said addition;-- be improved in the following described manner: By grading, filling and leveling the same, ~~and by placing macadam~~ along the center thereof for the width of eighteen (18) feet, and by placing macadam along the center thereof for the width of twelve (12) feet, and to a depth of eight (8) inches, of the usual kind and quality used for macadamizing streets in said City, and in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the Auditor and Police Judge. That said improvement shall be made in pursuance of the Council's declaration of intention to improve, and notice given of such intention.

Section 2. That the Auditor and Police Judge be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to call for bids for the making of said proposed improvement in the manner aforesaid, by publishing the same in two successive weekly issues of The Warrenton News, a weekly newspaper published in, and of general circulation in, said City of Warrenton.

Section 3. That upon said bids being received and opened, either by the Common Council, or by the Committee on Streets and Public Highways, at the time and place stated in said call for bids, such committee, or Council, or other person or persons, whom the Council may hereafter authorize, is authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the making of said proposed improvement, if, in the discretion of the Council, or committee aforesaid, thus considering said bids, any of said bids should be accepted, but if all of the bids received in pursuance of said call should, in the judgment of the Council, or said committee, be rejected, or if no bids be received, then, the Auditor and Police Judge is hereby authorized and directed to publish another call for bids, in the manner, and for the time, herein required for the first call for bids, the same authority being hereby given the Council or said Committee to open the second bids and enter into a contract for the making of said proposed improvement, in the manner hereinbefore stated, and other bids may be called for in like manner, so long as the Council or said committee, rejecting the bids, may by its motion so order.

Section 4. That, since said proposed improvement can be more advantageously done during the summer months, and while other similar work is being done in said City, and such improvement is absolutely necessary for use by the inhabitants of said proposed improvement district, in order to protect the public health, peace and safety of said City, and emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton, Oregon.

Section 5. That the time allowed by the charter and ordinances of said City of Warrenton, wherein interested persons might remonstrate against said proposed improvement, has elapsed, and no person or persons whomsoever has remonstrated, in any manner whatsoever, against said proposed improvement.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on July 1st, 1922.
