

AN ORDINANCE, AUTHORIZING THE IMPROVEMENT OF PARTS OF WHEELER STREET AND PACIFIC AVENUE, AS PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED IN THIS ORDINANCE, BY GRADING AND MACADAMIZING THE SAME, SUCH GRADING TO BE 15 FEET WIDE ALONG THE CENTER THEREOF, AND SUCH MACADAMIZING TO BE 9 FEET WIDE AND 8 INCHES THICK; OR BY BLANKING ALONG SAID GRADED PART OF SAID STREETS FOR THE WIDTH OF 9 FEET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That, in pursuance of the Council's intention, heretofore duly declared by resolution, it is hereby ordained that the following described portions of streets or public ways, to-wit: Beginning on Wheeler Street, at its intersection with the center line of Portland Avenue; thence running along the center of said Wheeler Street, in a Northerly direction, to its intersection with the center line of Pacific Avenue; thence along the center of Pacific Avenue, in a Westerly direction, to its intersection with the DYKE line on the Easterly bank of the Skipanon River; the said streets passing over parts of East Warrenton, and Portoria, in the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, Oregon;--

by grading and leveling the same along the center thereof for the width of fifteen (15) feet, and it being left optional with the Council to call for bids on two kinds of improvement, each to be nine (9) feet wide, along the center thereof, with proper turnouts, in either case, as follows:

- (1) Macadam, 9 feet in width, and 8 inches thick, with proper turnouts.
- (2) Planking, or board covering, 9 feet wide, and 3 inches thick, resting on sleepers 4"x6" in size, with suitable turnouts.

The Council shall use its best judgment and accept the bid on the type of improvement aforesaid which would seem to be for the best interests of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton and of those property owners, whose property must be assessed to pay the cost of same. The said proposed improvement shall be made in accordance with said resolution, and of the notice duly published in pursuance thereof, and with the plans and specifications for such improvement, now on file in the office of the Auditor and Police Judge, of said City.

Section 2. That the Auditor and Police Judge be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to call for bids for the making of said proposed improvement, in the manner aforesaid, by publishing the same in two successive issues of The Warrenton News, a weekly published in said City.

Section 3. That upon said bids being received and opened, either by the Council, or by the Committee on Streets and Public Highways, at the time and place stated in said call for bids, such Committee, or any other persons whom the Council may authorize, is hereby directed and empowered to enter into a contract for the making of said proposed improvement, if, in the discretion of the Council, or said Committee, considering said bids, any of said bids should be accepted, and if all of the bids received in pursuance of said call should, in the judgment of such Council or Committee, be rejected, or if no bids be received, then, the Auditor and Police Judge is hereby authorized and directed to publish another call for bids, in the manner and for the time herein required, for the first call for bids, the same authority being hereby given to open the second bids, as is herein given to open the first bids, accompanied by the same authority to execute a contract with the lowest responsible bidder, as hereinabove provided in the case of the first bids received, and other bids may be called for in like manner, so long as the Council, upon rejecting the bids, may by a resolution so order.

Section 4. That since said improvement can only be made advantageously during the Summer months, and such improvement is necessary for use by the inhabitants of said City, the enactment of this ordinance at this time, and the taking effect of the same immediately, is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and an emergency is, therefore, hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.

Section 5. That the time for remonstrance against said proposed improvement has elapsed, and no remonstrance thereto has been filed.
