

ORDINANCE NO. 343A

AN ORDINANCE LIMITING AND FIXING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON AND REPEALING ALL OTHER CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salary and compensation of the Chief of Police of the City of Warrenton be and is hereby limited and fixed in the sum of \$400.00 per month, effective the 1st day of January, 1956.

Section 2. That all other conflicting ^{parts of} ordinances be and are hereby repealed. *ERB*

Section 3. That inasmuch as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton in that economic conditions have changed and the Chief of Police has been faithful and efficient in the performance of his duties and warrants a raise, it is necessary to reset the salary of the Chief of Police who is necessary to the City in order that it may have police protection, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage by the City Commissioners of the City of Warrenton and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
