

ORDINANCE NO. 347A

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE MOTOR VEHICLE AND OTHER TRAFFIC BY PUTTING A TIME LIMIT ON PARKING DURING CERTAIN HOURS ON MAIN STREET BETWEEN THIRD AND FOURTH STREETS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE STREET, PROVIDING FOR OFFICIAL TRAFFIC SIGNS, PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, people park their motor vehicles all day on Main Street between Third and Fourth, and

WHEREAS, this is the main business section of the City of Warrenton.

NOW THEREFORE the City of Warrenton does ordain as follows:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to park his, her or its motor vehicle or other vehicles on Main Street between Third and Fourth on both sides of the street between the hours of 9 o'clock A.M. and 6 o'clock P.M., for a period longer than two hours at any one time, except on Sundays and legal holidays.

Section 2: That Ordinance 326A be and is hereby affirmed and this Ordinance be and is hereby made an additional Ordinance regulating vehicular traffic.

Section 3: That the placing of official traffic signs consisting of "no parking for over a period of two hours" on Main Street between Third and Fourth on both sides of the street in the City of Warrenton be and is hereby authorized.

Section 4: That every person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$150.00 or by imprisonment in the city jail of not more than thirty days or both such fine and imprisonment.
