

ORDINANCE NO. 426A

Introduced by Commissioner Quincy Robinson

AN ORDINANCE RAISING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION OF ALL OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON, EXCEPT THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSIONERS, THREE PER CENT. MORE THAN THEIR PRESENT COMPENSATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND ADDITIONAL FOR SOCIAL SECURITY FOR CITY MANAGER, TREASURER AND AUDITOR AND POLICE JUDGE AND RATIFICATION FOR 1961 PAYMENTS.

WHEREAS, the cost of living has increased during the past year,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salary and compensation of all the officers and employees of the City of Warrenton, except the Mayor and City Commissioners, be and is hereby raised Three per cent. more than the present compensation of said city employees or officers as set either by Ordinance, or otherwise, as of January 1, 1962, except the City Manager, Treasurer and <sup>Auditor and</sup> Police Judge be and is hereby raised Three per cent. plus an amount equal to <sup>0.15% of the salary</sup> the cost ~~to~~ <sup>from</sup> the City of Social Security contribution until said employee and officer comes under the Social Security Act; and the amount equal to the <sup>0.615% of the salary</sup> cost to the City of Social Security contributions which was paid to said officer in 1961 is hereby ratified. The total salary and compensation is to be computed to the nearest dollar.

Section 2. Whereas the cost of living has increased during the past year, in order to keep the employees happily employed and as an incentive to retain their services, including the police, street and water departments, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
