

ORDINANCE NO. 1964-10

Introduced by Commissioner Walter J. Gorman

AN ORDINANCE RAISING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION OF ALL OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON, EXCEPT THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSIONERS, THREE PER CENT. MORE THAN THEIR PRESENT COMPENSATION COMPUTED TO THE NEXT HIGHEST DOLLAR ABOVE ANY ODD CENTS, AND AN ADDITIONAL FOR SOCIAL SECURITY FOR CITY MANAGER, TREASURER AND AUDITOR AND POLICE JUDGE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the cost of living has increased during the past year,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salary and compensation of all the officers and employees of the City of Warrenton, except the Mayor and City Commissioners, be and is hereby raised Three per cent. more than the present compensation of said city employees or officers as set either by ordinance or otherwise, as of January 1, 1964, computed to the next highest dollar above any odd cents, except the City Manager, Treasurer and Auditor and Police Judge be and is hereby raised Three per cent. more than his present compensation plus an amount equal to the cost to the City for Social Security contribution until said employee and officer comes under the Social Security Act.


Section 2. Whereas the cost of living has increased during the past year, in order to keep the employees happily employed and as an incentive to retain their services, including the police, street and water departments, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
