

ORDINANCE NO. 465A

Introduced by Commissioner Earl JOHNSON

AN ORDINANCE RAISING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION OF ALL FULL TIME OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON TEN AND NO/100 (\$10.00) DOLLARS A MONTH MORE THAN THEIR PRESENT COMPENSATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the cost of living has increased during the past year,
NOW THEREFORE THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salary and compensation of all full time officers and employees of the City of Warrenton be and is hereby raised Ten and No/100 (\$10.00) Dollars per month more than the present compensation of said full time officers and employees as set either by ordinance, or otherwise, to take effect as of January 1, 1965.

Section 2. That whereas the cost of living has increased during the past year, in order to keep the full time officers and employees happily employed and as an incentive to retain their services, including the police, street and water departments, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
