

ORDINANCE NO. 470A

AN ORDINANCE RAISING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION OF ALL FULL TIME OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON THREE (3) PER CENT. MORE THAN THEIR PRESENT COMPENSATION COMPUTED TO THE NEXT HIGHEST DOLLAR ABOVE ANY ODD CENTS ~~AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.~~

WHEREAS the cost of living has increased during the past year,

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salary and compensation of all full time officers and employees of the City of Warrenton be and is hereby raised Three (3) per cent. more than the present compensation of said city employees or officers as set either by Ordinance or otherwise as of July 1, 1965, computed to the next highest dollar above any odd cents.

Section 2. That Whereas the cost of living has increased during the past year, in order to keep the full time officers and employees happily employed and as an incentive to retain their services, including the police, street and water department employees, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
