Section 1: "Section 20: Rates" of Ordinance 38-A is hereby amended as follows:

1. Residential Collection including multiple dwellings and mobile home parks: each dwelling unit is charged the minimum for scheduled service.

Section 2: Definitions:

The following words in this ordinance are defined as follows:

- a. Commercial-industrial refuse: solid waste materials from stores, shops, factories, processing plants or other manufacturing enterprises. The words include building rubbish, cardboard, papers, bottles, cans, furniture, metals and bedding.
- b. Food processing waste: All accumulated refuse from animal, fruit, vegetable matter, liquid or otherwise, that attends the preparation and/or use of meat, fish, vegetable and fruit, which are subject to decay and attraction for flies and rodents.

Section 3: These rates set forth herein shall insure that the costs of providing garbage and landfill service to those desiring its use will be on a cost-effective basis, and to continue the existing rates would result in an unfair subsidy of those using these services and an inequitable allocation of the city's resources; therefore, the city finds that an emergency exists and the rates as set forth herein shall go into full force and effect immediately upon the passage of this ordinance.
