ORDINANCE NO. 712-A.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9 (2) of ORDINANCE NO. 359-A, RELATING TO NUMBERING OF STRUCTURES IN THE CITY OF WARRENTON, OREGON.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Section 9 "Location and Type" (2) shall be amended to read as follows:

"(2) On all other structures, numbers shall be no less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches high and $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide; of non-corrosive material."

Section 2. Said amendment is made because the style and material of numbers as stipulated in Ordinance No. 359-A are no longer available and the city, having made many inquiries, is unable to locate any continuing, quantity supply of uniform numbers; also because property owners have expressed preference for numbers more in line with the architecture of the structures; and because numbers in various styles and materials are now much more readily available, in individual packets, to the citizens of the city.

Section 3. The City of Warrenton will continue, therefore, to sell such house numbers as are in stock, for the present rate of \$2.00, to those individuals wishing to purchase same. Property owners desiring other styles or materials may post such numbers as long as they meet size requirements and are easily discernible from the main street access.
