AMENDING SECTION 7 OF CITY OF WARRENTON ORDINANCE No. 828-A.

ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR REFUSE AND GARBAGE COLLECTION

WHEREAS, a change is necessary to that part of <u>Section 7</u> of Ordinance No. 828-A which establishes the maximum weight for the container to be used for refuse; and

WHEREAS, changing the maximum weight from **75** pounds to **65** pounds is for the benefit and health of those persons who must pick up and empty said containers; and

WHEREAS, such change is in conformance with the maximum weight allowed by other such services in the area;

NOW, THEREFORE, the city commission of the City of Warrenton, Oregon, ordains as follows:

Section 7 is hereby amended to read:

"Section 7. Refuse Container: All refuse shall be placed by the person upon whose premises the same is produced in a watertight, galvanized, metal container or approved plastic container, of not more than 32 gallons net capacity and of a design satisfactory to the supervisor of public works. The container, when empty, shall not weigh more than 15 pounds. When loaded, the container shall not weigh more than 65 pounds. A charge will be imposed for <u>any</u> overweight container. No container weighing 90 pounds or over will be picked up unless assistance is provided. The container shall be strong, capable of enclosing all contents, have handles at the sides, have a tight-fitting lid and shall be kept clean and continually closed except when refuse if being dumped into or removed therefrom. The contents of such container shall be collected by the city's collector, not less than once every two (2) weeks and more often if deemed necessary by the supervisor of public works, by the collector or otherwise disposed of as provided in this ordinance. The container shall be placed at such a point as to be free from all obstructions and easily accessible to the collector at all times."

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any article, section, subsection, subdivision, phrase, clause, sentence or word in this ordinance shall, for any reason, be held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not nullify the remainder of the ordinance, but shall be confined to the articles, section, subsection, subdivision, clause, sentence or word so held invalid or unconstitutional.
