#### 1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Thompson at 7:32 pm, followed by the opening ceremonies.

#### 2. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

## A. Biosolids Application Update

John Williams briefed the Council on updates on the Biosolids issue. He stated that today July 23, 2003 the City sent a letter to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requesting that the permit for the Zenthoefer site be revoke. Mr. Williams stated that it was expected to be approved. He stated that is was recommended there be no further applications on this site and the permit be revoked.

Mayor Thompson noted that the Staff had polled the Mayor and Council earlier in the day and the consensus was to with draw the permit and the application.

Mr. Vaughan passed out additional information and letters from the group known as O'Neil Corners Association.

Mr. Wain Vaughan, 10540 S Bremer Rd, Canby, spoke to the Council. He stated he and the association appreciated the Council taking this issue seriously and acting on the information. He stated there are a couple of concerns they still have. One being drainage, the stated that there was a possibility of a pipe going across the Zenthoefer property that has moving water, that might add to the problem as well as drainage tiles on the south side of Bremer Road where drain off would take waters into Milk Creek. Mr. Vaughan stated they would like to avoid that any draining there. Second issue he wanted to bring up the odor issue. Mr. Vaughan stated that if the where the application has been made could be plowed under it would eliminate the odor and get the waste to go into the soil better.

Mr. Craig Finden, 11628 Makin Lane, Canby, applauded the decision of the Council. He requested now that the issue has been addressed, that part of the solution was in taking the signs down. In indicated the also offended the senses. He felt it was part of the neighborhood esthetic and that it demonstrated the integral relationship between the City and the people that live in the surrounding area. He noted he appreciated the ability for the City and the people of County to work together for a solution.
