SPECIAL SESSION
OCTOBER 24, 2001

Mayor Terry Prince presiding. Council members present Randy Carson, Patrick Johnson, Shirley Strong, Walt Daniels, and Teresa Blackwell.

Also present: City Administrator Mark Adcock, City Attorney John Kelley, Library and Parks Director Beth Saul, Community Development and Planning Director John Williams, Marty Moretty, Leonard and Donna Walker, Joyce Peters, Ron Berg, Lisa Weygandt, Ted Kunze, Wayne Oliver, Linda Runyan-Finden, and Craig Finden.

Mayor Prince called the special session to order at 7:33 p.m., followed by the opening ceremonies and a moment of silence in remembrance of the postal workers.

CITIZEN INPUT ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS: Carolyn Anne Carson Graybill residing at 262 SE 9th Avenue, Canby expressed her desire for the Canby Municipal Swim Center to remain open. She became aware of its potential closure next year and was asked to sign a petition to keep it open. She uses it in the early mornings and during that time it is well-attended by disabled working, and senior citizens. The staff and those who attend are all friendly; it is good for the whole community - the teens, swim teams, children, adults and seniors.

ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS:

Ordinance 1083 -

****Councilor Carson moved to adopt Ordinance 1083, AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY FOR THE WILLAMETTE - MOLALLA RIVER GREENWAY PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY on final reading. Motion was seconded by Councilor Strong and passed by roll call vote 5-0.**

CITIZEN INPUT: None.

MANAGERS' /COUNCILORS REPORTS: Status Report on Canby Public Transportation System - Community Development and Planning Director John Williams announced that this morning, the Tri-Met Board voted 7-0 to approve Canby's withdrawal to be effective January 1, 2002.

Canby's next steps now will be to pass a transit ordinance and appoint an advisory board.

Mayor Prince said that the withdrawal was being well-received in Oregon City and this was a "win" for everyone.

Make a Difference Day - City Administrator Mark Adcock referred to a brochure that was before them announcing that the "Make a Difference Day" would be this Saturday, October 27, 2001

from 10am to 2pm at Community Park. He invited any of the Councilors who would be available, to come and participate. Any questions, please call him, Robin Adcock, or Matilda Deas with the Planning Department.

Children's Safety Seat Check - Mayor Prince made note that this would also be held this Saturday, October 27th at 9:00 a.m. at Burgerville. It would be a good opportunity for parents to bring their child car seats to have a safety inspection.

Canby Depot Museum Open House and Antique Appraisal - Councilor Blackwell stated that this would also be happening on Saturday from noon until 4 p.m.

Clackamas County Coordinating Committee - As liaison to this committee, Councilor Blackwell asked the Councilors to look over the material she had passed out to them as a result of this meeting, asking them to read and give her feedback before the next meeting on November 15th. Issues range from transportation to utility fees and all will have an effect on Canby.

Mayor Prince said that there will be issues that Canby will have to face and could potentially mean less income for us, as we are further out in the County. This will effect other cities such as Sandy and Molalla; he knows that Sandy is none too pleased so far.

ACTION REVIEW:

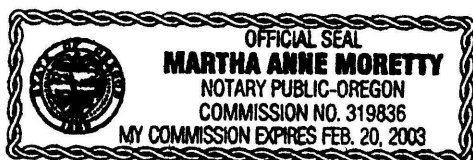

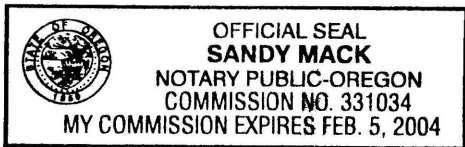
