### NOTES FROM PARKS MASTER PLAN WORKSHOP

#### March 20, 20017:00 PMCanby Adult Center

A joint meeting of the City Council, Planning Commission, and Park and Recreation Advisory Board

The workshop started at 7:10 PM and ended at 8:40 PM. The topic of discussion was the update of the Parks Master Plan and how to incorporate the changes into the Comprehensive Plan and Subdivision Ordinance. The following points were considered to be important in completing the work on the updated plan:

- Make statistics on demographics consistent with Buildable Lands study and other statistics being used in the Comp plan update
- Use 2020 as the target date when calculating population growth, etc.
- Create a foundation to get donations of money or land for parks
- Create a fundraising arm of the parks department
- Explore having Canby Kids and other users increase fees and contribute part to park maintenance (Canby Kids already does this for softball and soccer fields)
- Explore creation of a park district.
- Create an Acquisition Plan as soon as possible.
- Explore instituting "development rights" fees and corresponding "credits" for dedication of parkland during development.
- Finalize the 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue park master plan (get it adopted)
- Leave flexibility in the 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue plan to move the pool to another location if that is more cost effective
- Prioritize projects and the Acquisition Plan

After the Parks Master Plan Update is put into is final form with these points addressed as much as possible, the Master Plan will come before the Council and Planning Commission at public hearings before adoption of the update takes place.
