SPECIAL MEETING

MAY 27, 1981

Mayor Robert A. Swayze presiding. Councilmembers present: David Anderson, Lee Funrue, Beryl Brown, Michael Gabrion, William Pulver and Gary Sowles.

Also present: Administrator Harold Wyman, City Planner Stephan Lashbrook, Public Works Director Ken Ferguson, Secretary Marilyn Perkett, John Falkenstein, David Bury, Les Page and Dan and Sue Bradley.

Mayor Swayze called the special meeting to order at 7:30 p.m., followed by the flag salute and a moment of silent meditation. Roll call of Council showed a quorum and all six members present.

Administrator Wyman presented the abstract of votes from the May 19, 1981, City election sent by the Clackamas County Clerk's office: "A" Ballot - Yes, 709 and No, 566 and "B" Ballot - Yes, 615 and No, 640. A copy of the abstract will be attached to these minutes. \*\*Councilwoman Brown moved to accept the abstract of votes from the Clackamas County Clerk for the May 19, 1981, City Election. Seconded by Councilman Gabrion and approved unanimously.


Mr. Wyman informed the Council of the following: June 17, 1981, the Public Hearing has been scheduled for the proposed 1981-82 City Budget: the Library Board has hired a new man for the position of City Librarian; all necessary paperwork has been prepared and taken to the County Elections Department for the June 30th election date for the "B" Ballot; and June 29th the Police Association will be going into binding arbitration and David Blair was meeting tonight with the Public Works and Office Employees Association.

Administrator Wyman also informed the Council that he had received another unanticipated revenue from SAIF in the amount of \$15,000.

Mayor Swayze recessed the special meeting at 7:37 p.m. to go into workshop session on Cable TV.

Mayor Swayze reconvened the special meeting at 9:00 p.m. At this time, Councilwoman Funrue announced a possible conflict of interest regarding the Cable TV issue since she had previously worked for Liberty Communications, employment terminated in January, 1975. Mrs. Funrue stated she felt she personally would not have a conflict and the Council concurred at this time.

Mayor Swayze adjourned the special meeting at 9:02 p.m.
