ITEM TITLE: RIDERSHIP UPDATE

PURPOSE: To provide the Board with an update on current ridership trends.

ROLE OF THE BOARD: The Board's role in this instance is to obtain information.

<u>HISTORY</u>: Beginning with the closure of the UO during the week of March 16, LTD's ridership experienced a decline until the week of March 23 when data indicates that ridership leveled out.

Trends in Fixed-Route Service


Figure 1 - Fixed-Route Ridership Trends March 2, 2020 - April 3, 2020

Figure 1 provides an overall view of LTD's ridership trends between March 2 and April 4, 2020. Overall, all routes have experienced ridership reductions. In particular, EmX and LTD's Core routes have seen heavy reductions, though EmX continues to carry the majority of overall ridership. LTD's ridership has gone from an average of about 35,000 boardings per day on an average weekday in 'normal' times to about 10,000 boardings on an average weekday. This represents about a 70% reduction in our ridership – similar to what is being seen across the country. During this period of time, evening service (after 8:30 PM) - has been fairly stable at about 800 average weeknight boardings.

Anecdotally, we've also seen hiring advertisements for people to stock shelves at places like Costco, Fred Meyer's, other grocery stores, and similar types of outlets (work that usually takes place in the evening and early morning). It is with that reality in mind, that it was decided to move to a modified Sunday service, which is operating from 7:30 AM to 10:30 PM (starting today), rather than the 8:30 AM to 8:30 PM span that would normally be operated on Sundays.

Another finding is in how we see people using the system as a whole. Interestingly, it appears that over the course of the day we're seeing some level of ridership on all routes (where EmX continues to be generating the majority of boardings: ~ 45%). In addition, we have seen that most of the decline in our ridership has been in the level of our midday ridership (10 AM - 5 PM). This is understandable given that students make most of their trips in the midday. Figure 2 illustrates the change in LTD's ridership by time of day.

In the context of who might be using LTD's services during this period of time, it is useful to consider which community residents are most transit dependent. Though there are likely many factors that would cause someone to be dependent on transit, income, access to a vehicle, and possession of a driver's license are important factors. In LTD's recent Origin-Destination Survey, 61% of riders indicated that they do not have a driver's license. Many riders (46%) live in households that do not own a car. While many students do not have access to a vehicle, nearly as many non-students lack driver's licenses or vehicles. Transit dependence is much more highly tied to income. A high percentage of LTD's ridership is comprised of lower-income individuals who tend to ride transit more days per week than those who have higher incomes.

Trends in RideSource Operations




Figure 3 – RideSource Call Center Activity

Data has been gathered on LTD's RideSource operations during this time period. Figure 3 provides an overview of the RideSource Call Center Activity between March 17 and March 26. This data shows a significant reduction on RideSource call activity in that period. Figure 4 provides 2020 RideSource Trips by Date and Program. Again, this data illustrates the significant drop in the use of RideSource over the last two weeks.

Ridership productivity is not the goal at this time. This is true for a couple of reasons; first, we need to make sure that we are providing a 'useful' level of service - one that meets the demands we are observing during this period; and second, we need to run enough frequency to avoid too many people on a bus at one time (almost an 'anti-productivity'


requirement). This can be characterized as a "Public Health First" approach to service deployment - safely operate the minimum level of service that can be provided for essential trip making in the region.

Ridership levels will continue to be monitored closely as conditions change.


- 1) Figure 1 LTD's ridership trends between March 2 and April 4, 2020

Note: The UO ended on-campus classes starting March 16th. This also coincided with the start of Finals Week when we see a general drop in ridership as well.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To request that the Board of Directors defer making a decision on LTD's future service model as described in Transit Tomorrow until after the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic restrictions have been lifted.

ROLE OF THE BOARD: The Board's role in this instance is to adopt a decision making process for LTD's future service model.

<u>HISTORY</u>: On March 8, Governor Kate Brown declared an emergency due to the public health threat posed by the novel infectious COVID-19. On March 12, Governor Brown prohibited gatherings of 250 or more people. Then on March 17, Governor Brown prohibited gatherings of 25 or more people requiring LTD's Board President to cancel the March meeting of the LTD Board of Directors.

On March 30, a Special Board Meeting was held via video and audio technology (Zoom) to address the need for the Board of Directors to take action in the event of a significant threat to employees and public health. Given the need for LTD to focus on the health of its employees and the public, there is limited capacity to continue with a public engagement process for a future service model that was part of Transit Tomorrow. Additionally, the current COVID-19 restrictions are not appropriate for effective communication of such an important decision.

Staff will engage the Board in a discussion to gather input and to request deferring a decision until the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions have been lifted.

<u>CONSIDERATIONS</u>: The Board can direct staff to pause the Transit Tomorrow process until COVID-19 restrictions are lifted. COVID-19 restrictions are anticipated to last through the end of April but could continue through May. June or July may be the first opportunity to have a discussion at an in-person Board meeting.

<u>ALTERNATIVES</u>: The Board could choose to expedite the decision-making process or slow it down more than is being recommended.

NEXT STEPS: Based on the Board of Directors decision, staff will develop a timeline and communication plan.
