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RIDESHARE REPORT

- Increased the net number of current commuters in the active rideshare database from 552 on January 1, 2005, to 1,051. Of that total, 353 are SchoolPool registrants and 698 are Commuters.
- There are 272 work/school sites represented in the database.
- There are 109 commuters registered for the Emergency Ride Home (ERH) only.

VALLEY VANPOOL REPORT

- Continued work on new incentive programs for the Valley VanPool partnership.
- Revised MOU to enhance our working arrangements.
- Applied for and was awarded a \$310,000 ODOT grant to fund a vanpool fare subsidy program that will help to grow the vanpool program and establish a long-term, sustainable subsidy fund in cooperation with our area transit districts. Vans will be subsidized at varying percentages of their lease costs, which depends on route miles, so that routes as short as 10 miles (one-way) can receive some support while still assuring that they are sustainable based on FTA funds generated. We expect that this subsidy program, especially in light of increasing fuel prices, will help to substantially increase vanpooling in the region.
- We expect to begin actual subsidies for Valley VanPool vans and a new marketing campaign to initiate new vanpool routes in the Winter of 2005.
- Contracts have been signed between Lane Transit District, Salem-Keizer Transit District, VPSI, and
 the current vanpool provider, which will enable the districts to report vanpool Vehicle Revenue Miles
 (VRM) through the National Transit Database (NTD) reporting system. Ridership data collection for
 our nine Valley VanPool vans began in April of 2005 with data consolidated by VPSI. Reports are
 then forwarded to the transit districts and all of the Valley Vanpool partners for their use.
