Petition was referred to the Street Committee for recommendation.

Resolution No. 22 authorizing the installation of Stop signs at 7th Street at the Ash, Vine, and Rose Street intersections, at 5th Street at the A. B. C. D. and F. Street intersections, and at the Airport Road on 5th Street, making 7th, 5th and Airport Road through streets, was read in full. Motion by Beard seconded by Fuller that Resolution be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Letter was read from the State Sanitary Authority advising of their program for summer testing for stream pollution in the Willamette River and tributaries and requesting that the City aid in taking samples of the water in the Santiam River near the Sewage Treatment Plant.

Motion by Davis seconded by Fuller that all bills that have been Okayed by the Finance Committee be paid and warrants drawn for same. Motion carried and so ordered.

At 8:00 P.M. bids were opened and read as follows: for Storm sewer construction bids received from Scott Plumbing company in the amount of \$3530.55 and from Den-Herder Plumbing Co. in the amount of \$3827.25. - for sidewalk construction on Williams Street from Lebanon Sand and Gravel in the amount of \$187.50 and from Robert G. Wright in the amount of \$160.50, for the Street paving program from Lebanon Sand and Gravel in the amount of \$48,325.29 and from Western Paving and Construction in the amount of \$56,815.22 which included \$3928.50 for common excavation, - for excavation for the widening of Park and 2nd Streets from Lebanon Sand and Gravel in the amount of \$1670.00 and from Western Paving and Construction in the amount of \$1736.80.

After short recess the Street Committee recommended that the construction of the sidewalk on Williams Street be awarded to Robert G. Wright for \$160.50, and Storm sewer construction be awarded to Scott Plumbing company in the amount of \$3530.55 with Ordinance for contract to be read at next Council meeting, Committee advised that they would go over the bids for street paving and arrange for Ordinance for contract and award bid at next Council meeting.

Ordinance Bill No. 32 authorizing contract between the City and Robert G. Wright for construction of sidewalk on the West side of Williams Street from Lodge Street intersection north approximately 125 feet was read in full for the first time. By unanimous rollcall vote the bill was read the second and third times by title only and passed by unanimous rollcall vote. The votes being YES the Mayor declared the bill passed and the title of the bill shall become the title of the Ordinance No. 1000.

Motion by Heimerdinger seconded by Davis, Council adjourned.

Special budget committee meeting was held in the Council room at the City Hall at 1:30 P.M. with the following members present: Chairman J. H. Irvine, Secretary Bert Bellinger, and members Vern Reeves, Vic Carlson, Albert Smith, Clay Nichols, Ralph Scroggin, Kenneth Fuller, R. E. Davis, R. E. Heimerdinger, Joe McPherson, Mal C. Beard. Also present were Recorder Van R. Thome and various members of the press.

Considerable discussion was had relative to the defeat of the levy for \$59,077.00 for General Fund expenditures in the special election held on June 7, and whether the small vote reflected the wishes of the citizens due to possible confusion of the necessity of the expenditures and the purpose for which the election was held.

Motion by Reeves seconded by Beard that the Committee hold a public hearing at 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday June 11 in the Council Chambers in the City Hall to present the budget items and determine whether existing services could be reduced to comply with the results of the election or whether another election should be held at a later date. Motion carried and so ordered.

Motion by Daviss seconded by Reeves, Council adjourned.

Special public meeting was held at 8:00 P.M. by the Budget Committee. Chairman J. H. Irvine thoroughly explained the various expenditures budgeted in the General Fund and the necessity of the additional \$59,077.00 required in order to maintain existing services. Approximately 80 citizens were in attendance at the meeting and they voted unanimously a request that the City hold another election to re-submit the budget and tax levy to the voters of the City.
