RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, it appears from an examination of the City Records that, for a period of more than two years last past, none of the ordinances passed and adopted by the City Council, of the people, of the City of Lebanon, have been "enrolled in a well bound book", as required by the City Charter and by Ordinance No. 11, nor copied into any book whatever, but the same have simply been kept on file in typewritten form; and,

WHEREAS, it appears that numerous errors have been made in the numbering of said ordinances, whereby in some instances two or more ordinances have been given the same number, and other ordinances have been given no numbers whatever, and confusion exists in regard to the same; and,

WHEREAS, the last ordinance heretofore enrolled in the book of ordinances which was kept prior to the period above mentioned, is designated in said ordinance book as Ordinance No. 108, which said ordinance was passed and approved on the 8th day of September, 1911; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, that the City Recorder be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered to expend on behalf of the City the sum of Lifty (600) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purchase of a suitable book in which to enroll the city ordinances, and for the work of having the same enrolled therein; and,

Be it further resolved that all ordinances passed and adopted subsequent to said Ordinance No. 108 be numbered consecutively in the order of their final passage,

commencing with the number 109, without regard to the numbers by which they shall have been heretofore designated; but that, where such number differs from the number by which such ordinance was formerly designated, such fact shall be noted in parenthesis, after the Ordinance Number thus "(Formerly No.___)", (stating former number).
