RESOLUTION REQUIRING RE-BUILDING OF SIDEWALK.

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Streets has reported in writing to the Council that the sidewalk along the West side of Main Street, in front of the premises which begin at a point which is 305 feet North of the Northeast corner of Lot 2, Block 16, Original Plat of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, and runking thence North to the Catholic Church property, is in a defective and dangerous condition, in that the South end of said walk, near the Southeast corner of said premises, is about two feet higher than the walk on the adjoining property on the South thereof, and ends in an abrupt precipice of about two feet, and further, that said walk lacks about ten or twelve feet of extending to the South line of said premises; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON:

B. Elkins, be, and she is hereby, required and ordered, to build, repair and rebuild the sidewalk along the East front of the South part of said premises, from the Southeast corner of said premises to a point thirty (30) feet North of said Southeast corner, within twenty. (20) days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, , by building thereon a concrete walk of standard width and specifications, according to the provisions of the sidewalk ordinance of said City now in force governing the construction of sidewalks in said district, being Ordinance No. A. passed and approved on the \_\_\_\_\_\_day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 19\_\_\_; said walk to be built on an even slope, commencing on the South end at the grade of the walk on the premises adjoining on the South, and slop-

ing upward to the grade of the present walk in front of the premises first above mentioned; and,

Be it further resolved that the Superintendent of Streets proceed at once to serve notice hereof upon the said Mary B. Elkins, or such other person or persons as may be found to be the owner or owners of said premises.
