RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENTION TO IMPROVE CERTAIN PARTS OF GRANT AND THIRD STREETS, AND APPROVING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, by resolution duly passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, at a regular meeting thereof held on the 7th day of April, 1914, the said City Council declared it expedient and necessary to improve that part of Grant Street in said City, extending from the West line of Second Street, West to the railroad tracks of the Southern Pacific Company, and that part of Third Street in said City, extending from the North line of Grant Street, North to the South line of Sherman Street, in the following manner and particulars, to-wit:

1. By grading said streets to proper sub-grade;
2. By constructing concrete curbing where the same has not already been constructed;
3. By paving the same with gravel bitulithic paving for such width as may be determined to be proper;
4. By providing suitable surface drainage, and such other accessories as may be proper foraa finished job of paving;

AND, WHEREAS, by said resolution, the Council authorized and instructed the City Engineer of said City to prepare plans and specifications appropriate for such improvements, together with estimates of the work to be done and the cost thereof, and to file the same with the City Recorder;

AND, WHEREAS, the said City Engineer has prepared and filed the said plans, specifications and estimates, as by said resolution directed, and the same are now on file in the office of the said City Recorder, bearing file mark of the 21st day of April, 1914, and the Council has examined the same and finds them satisfactory as originally submitted, and approves the same; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON:

1st. That the said plans, specifications and estimates be, and the same are hereby, approved and adopted, and the said City Council hereby declares its purpose and intention to make the said street improvements therein described and specified, that is to say: to improve that part of Grant Street in said City extending from the West line of Second Street, West to the railroad tracks of the Southern Pacific Company, and that part of Third Street in said City extending from the North line of Grant Street, North to the South line of Sherman Street, in the following manner and particulars, to-wit:

1. By grading said streets to proper sub-grade;
2. By constructing concrete curbing where the same has not already been constructed;
3. By paving the same with gravel bitulithic paving, such paving to be of the width of thirty-two (32) feet on Grant Street, and of the width of forty-six (46) feet on Third Street;
4. By construction of gutters, inlets, catch-basins &c. to provide for surface drainage.

2nd. That all of the said grading of said streets, and the paving of the street intersections, are to be paid

for by the said City of Lebanon, out of the general fund, and the balance of the cost of all of said improvements is to be borne by the abutting property and property specially benefitted thereby;

3rd. That the estimated cost of said improvements, as shown by said plans, specifications and estimates filed by the City Engineer, is \$5,746.50, the estimated cost of the part thereof to be paid by the City of Lebanon, as aforesaid, being \$1,053.95, and the estimated cost of the part to be borne by the abutting and specially benefitted property being \$4,692.55;

4th. That notice of the purpose and intention of the Council to make such improvements shall be given by the City Recorder for ten (10) days by publication in the "Lebanon Criterion", a weekly newspaper published in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, which notice shall conform to the requirements of Section 199 of the present City Charter.
