

IN THE MATTER OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF CLEVELAND STREET.

RESOLUTION NO. 5 FOR 1922.

WHEREAS, On the 9th day of October 1922, there was filed with the Recorder of the city of Lebanon, a petition asking for the improvement of Cleveland Street in said City from Isabella Street North to Dodge Street, and

WHEREAS, On the 8 day of ~~October~~ November 1922, the common Council of the said City of Lebanon, duly passed Resolution No. 4 for 1922, requiring of the City engineer of the said city plans, specifications and the estimate of the total probable costs of the said improvement as asked for in the said petition, and as herein after mentioned and described and set out. And

WHEREAS; On the said 8 day of November 1922, the said city engineer filed with the recorder of the said city his report in writing of his plans, specifications and the estimates of the total probable costs of the said improvement of the said street as asked for the said petition, and wherein he reported therein that the said petition was signed by ^{the owners} more than a majority of all the abutting real property on the said proposed improvement and of the real property specially benefitted thereby, which said improvements are as follows:

CLEVELAND STREET from Isabella Street ~~South~~ to Dodge Street; and the said to be made as follows:

- 1st, By grading the said street to proper subgrade.
- 2nd, By Graveling the roadway of the said street not to exceed 12 feet in width with Crushed gravel
- 3rd, By making proper drainage for the said street.

NOW THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, that the said plans, specifications and estimates of the total probable cost of the said improvement of the said street as asked by in the said petition be and the same is hereby in all things approved, ratified and confirmed. And Be It Further resolved by the said Council that the said council finds and ascertains from the said report of the said engineer and from the said petition and from examination that the said peti-

tion as filed with the recorder of said City on the 9th day of October, 1922, asking for the said improvement is duly signed by the owners of more than a majority of all the Real property abutting on the said improvement and by more than a majority of all the real property specially benefitted thereby, and that the said petition asks that the said improvement be made without any further notice to the owners of the abutting real property or the real property specially benefitted thereby, and without advertising or receiving any bids for the making of said improvement and that the same be made and done by the City of Lebanon, Oregon. And Be It Further Resolved by the said Council that by reason of the said petition and as provided by Article IV of the Charter of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, that the said City of Lebanon has acquired jurisdiction to make the said improvement as prayed for in the said petition, And

Be It Further Resolved, by the said Council, that the city of Lebanon deems it expedient and for the best interest of the said city to make the said improvement as prayed for in the said petition, and that the said city proceed to make or cause the same to be made and done as prayed for in said petition, without any further notice or the advertising for bids for same, and that the city do the grading of the said street at the expense of the city and that the city do the other work at the cost and expense of the owners of the abutting real property and the real property specially benefitted thereby, and that the said work be done under the direction of the city engineer and the superintendent of Streets of the said City, and the committee on streets and public property of the said City of Lebanon, and as provided by the charter and ordinances of the said city.

Passed by the Council this 8 day of November, 1922, on roll call of the council all members elected to the Council voting in favor of the said resolution by aye and nay vote and the vote entered in the journal of the council proceedings.
