

RESOLUTION NO. 12 FOR 1931.

Introduced by Councilman Landstrom.

Whereas pursuant to call for bids for the erection of a municipal building in accordance with the plans and specifications on file with the City Recorder, sealed bids have been received from the following persons or firms, to-wit:

Harden & Son
Looney & Tower
E. L. Keebler.

And whereas this is the time and place set for the receiving and opening of such bids and accepting or rejecting bids, and the Council having opened all bids and having considered the same and being now fully advised as to the best responsible bid, and

Whereas the bid of Harden & Son for \$2880.00 is considered by the Council as the best responsible bid for the erection of said building and the Council being of the opinion that said bid is a reasonable bid for the erection of said building and that a more favorable bid could not be had by a re-advertisement for bids,

Therefore be it resolved that the bid of Harden & Son be and the same is hereby determined to be the best responsible bid and be it further resolved that the said bid of Harden & Son be and the same is hereby accepted.

Be it further resolved that this bid is accepted upon the express condition that all material for said building shall be purchased from Lebanon dealers, prices being equal, and this condition shall be made a condition in the contract and further that local labor be employed.
