

RESOLUTION NO. 5

FOR 1933

WHEREAS, several proposals have been made by various organizations, persons and federal agencies interested in constructing sewage disposal plants and loaning money for the purpose of the construction thereof by cities in the Willamette valley, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Lebanon deems it inexpedient, unnecessary and improper to increase the indebtedness of said city at this time for the purpose of a survey for or the construction of a sewage disposal plant,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, OREGON, that all offers of advice, surveys and loans for the ultimate purpose of the construction of a sewage disposal plant for said city be rejected until such time as it shall appear that the construction thereof is imperative to the public health and best interests of said city.
