RLBOLUTION NO. 6 FOR 1954

Council has by Ordinance declared the cemetary grounds located between Carolina Street and Dodge Street and West of Grove Street to be an abandoned cemetary, to have become deteriorated and overgrown with weeds, trees, shrubs and other uncontrolled growth and to be so located to endanger the health, welfare, comfort and safety of the public and that the public welfare requires that cemetary be discontinued and relocated and cleared.

WHEREAS, because of the increase in population of the area outside of and adjacent to the City limits of the City of Lebanon, it is probable that within the next few years a considerable portion of this area may be annexed to the City of Lebanon, and, if so ennexed, that sewer lines and additions to the sewage disposal plant may be required to take care of the additional territory, and

WHEREAS, it is the judgment of the City Council that a reserve should be set up for the development of parks within the City, and

Wilmas, funds will be required to defray the cost of the foregoing, and it is necessary, expedient, and advisable that the Council submit to the voters of the City of Lebanon at a special election to be held at the same time as the general election of November 2, 1954, for their approval or rejection a proposal for a special levy of a 5 mill serial tax for the purpose of raising funds to defray expenses which may be incurred in connection with

any or all of the forecoing projects.

NOW THE REFORM THE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon that there be submitted to the legal voters of said city, for their approval or rejection, at a special election to be held simultaneously and contemporaneously with the general election on November 2, 1954 the following proposition authorizing a special tax levy.

AN ACT Authorizing A Special Levy For Parks, Sewer System, And Condemnation Of The Cemetary Between Carolina And Dodge Streets And West Of Grove Street And Expenses Incidental Thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBAMON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, by and through its City Council, be and it is authorized and empowered to levy a 5 mill tax a ainst all taxable property within the cornorate limits of said City, outside the limitations imposed by Article XI, Section II, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon for each of the 5 tax years beginning with the fiscal tax year, 1955-56 to and including the fiscal pax year of 1959-60 for the purpose of providing funds for the future developement of the sewer system of the said City including the construction of sewer lines and additions to the sewage disposal plant, acquisition and development, of park sites, condemnation and acquisition of the cemetary property located between Carolina and Dodge Streets and Worst of Grove Street in said City and all expenses incidental thereto, and for all or any one or combination of such purposes, and to use the funds drived from such tax for such purposes.

That the Ballot Title of said proposed proposition submitted by the City Attorney is hereby approved and shall be as follows:

BALLOT TITLE

An act authorizing the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oreson, by its City Council to levy, for the purpose of providing and using funds for the future development of the sewer system, acquisition and development of parks, condemnation and acquisition of the cemetary between Carolina and Dodge Streets, Wist of Grove Street, a 5 mill tax against all taxable property within the limits of said City outside the constitutional 6 per cent limitation of the State of Oregon for each of the 5 fiscal tax years, 1955-56 to 1959-60 inclusive.

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVLD That the foregoing proposed

proposition be forthwith filed with the City decorder for submission by her to the legal voters of the City of Lebanon at a special election called for the purpose of voting on said proposition at the same time as the general election on November 2, 1954.
