RESOLUTION DEFINING THE SPECIFICATIONS FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS TO BE BORNE BY THE PROPERTY OWNERS.

RESOLUTION NO. 3 for 1956

WHEREAS, the Ordinances and the Charter of the City of Lebanon provide that the abutting owners of property shall pay for the street improvements in the proportion that the said abutting property is specifically benefitted, and,

WHEREAS, there are certain streets in the City of Lebanon that carry through traffic and for that reason should be wider, have a heavier base, or heavier surfacing, or any combination of the aforementioned than is considered standard and would be more cost than said street improvements would specifically benefit the abutting property, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON,

That at any time a petition for street improvements is received by the Common Council petitioning the said Council for improvement of streets in which more than 50% of the abutting property owners have signed said petition, and it is in the opinion of the Common Council that the street should be wider, have a heavier base, or heavier surfacing, or any combination of the aforementioned than a standard street, the City may as a general obligation of the City, pay for such additional width, additional base, or additional thickness in surfacing; and for the purpose of defining a standard street it shall hereafter be construed by the City that any street that is more than 32 feet from curb to curb or requires more than 7 inches of base or more than 2 inches of surfacing, such excess cost shall be borne by the City of Lebanon as a general obligation, provided that funds are available to provide for such additional cost.
