

RESOLUTION

(U.S. 20)

6 Jan 1959

WHEREAS, State Highway No. 16 of the State of Oregon, known as the Santiam Highway, is routed through the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, a municipal corporation, and the route officially adopted for said highway by the State Highway Commission traverses the following street or streets, or avenues, of said city; to wit:

Beginning at Highway Engineer's Center Line Survey Station 700+97 and extending in a southerly direction to Highway Engineer's Center Line Survey Station 785+05.

AND, WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission of the State of Oregon is desirous of receiving Federal Aid for the improvement of said highway,

AND, WHEREAS, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Public Roads, will not participate in the construction of said highway until and unless the said City of Lebanon will guarantee by resolution officially adopted by the City Council of said city that no encroachments will be permitted upon the right of way of said highway within the corporate limits of said city which will permanently obstruct or interfere with the free and convenient flow of traffic over said highway through said city; and will so regulate parking of vehicles on said streets or avenues traversed by said highway that the free, convenient, and safe flow of traffic shall not be impeded; and agree not to impose unreasonable limitations of speed upon said highway, nor impose any regulations of traffic which will operate to discriminate against traffic upon said highway by giving undue preference to traffic upon other intersecting streets or avenues.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, that no encroachments will be permitted on the streets and avenues traversed by State Highway No. 16 of the State of Oregon, known as the Santiam Highway, which will permanently or unduly interfere with the free and convenient flow of traffic along said highway; and will so regulate the parking of vehicles along said streets and avenues as not to impede the free, convenient, and safe flow of traffic; and will not impose any unreasonable limitations of speed upon said highway, nor impose any regulation of traffic upon said highway which shall unduly discriminate against traffic upon said highway by giving undue preference to traffic upon other intersecting streets or avenues.

It being understood that nothing in this resolution of agreement by the City Council shall be construed so as to prevent or impair proper police regulations and the enforcement of all existing ordinances and regulations respecting the use of streets in said city, nor to prevent such temporary obstructions to traffic as may be necessitated by the construction of water or gas mains, sewers, and other public improvements, or to preclude the proper use of said highway for the placement of telephone or electric light poles or other public service facilities.

Passed by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, this 5th day of MAY, 1959.

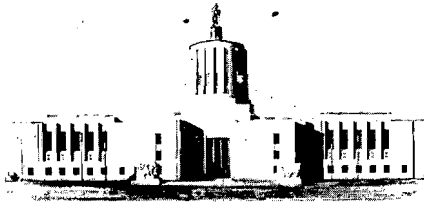

Dear Mr. Thome:

The State Highway Commission plans to accept bids for construction of the Main Street (Lebanon-Santiam Canal) Section of the Santiam Highway (U.S. 20) in Salem on May 26.

This project is to be partially financed with Federal funds, and in projects of this nature it is a requirement of the Bureau of Public Roads that the city concerned adopt a standard form of encroachment resolution covering that portion of the project within the corporate limits. This resolution provides that the city will permit no encroachments upon the right-of-way which will permanently interfere with the free and convenient flow of traffic.

It would be appreciated if you will present this resolution to the City Council, and if adopted, return four signed copies to this office. So that there will be no delay in awarding a contract, please mail the signed copies so that they will arrive in Salem prior to May 22, 1959.

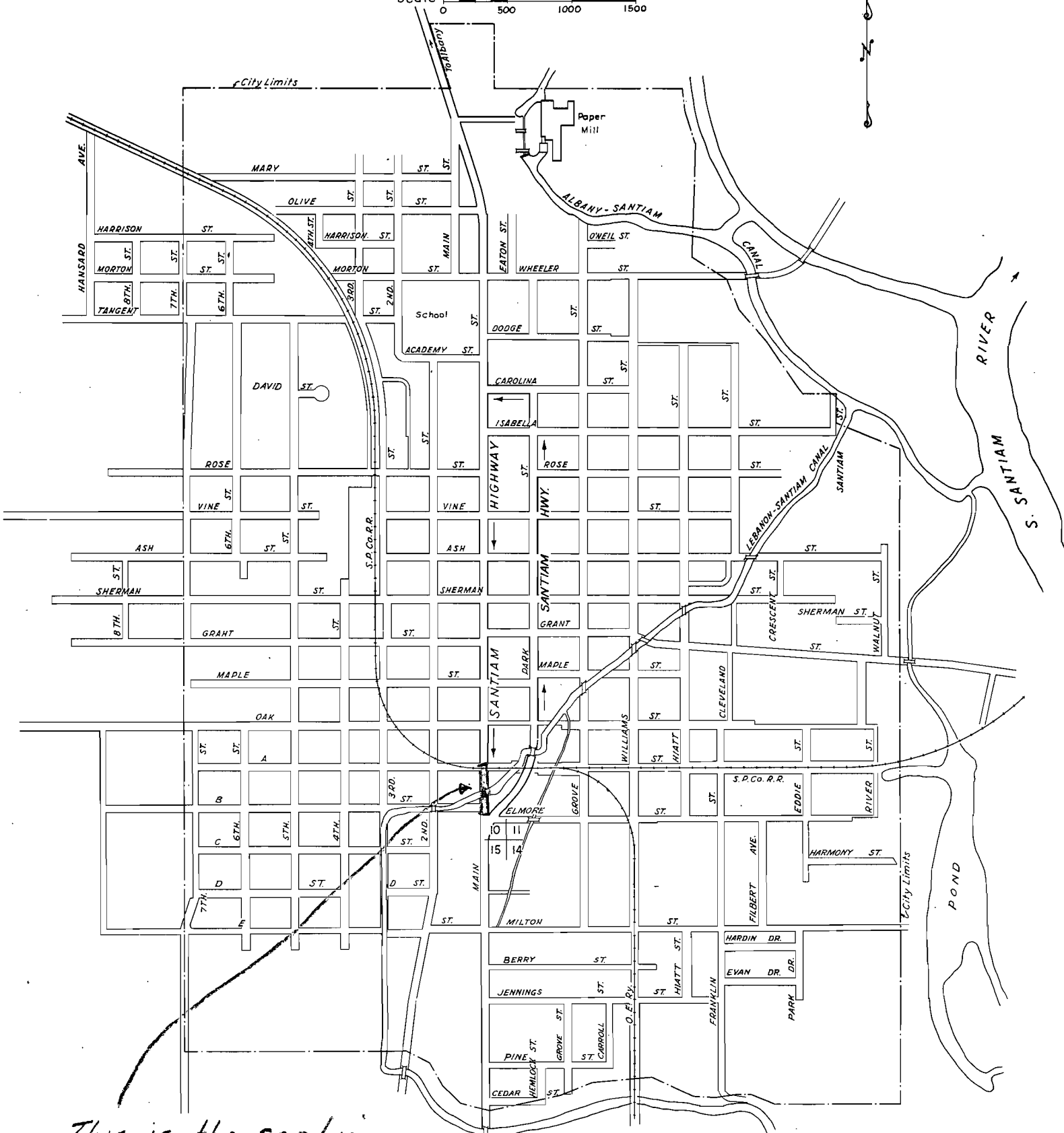
