AND PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION)
OF STOP SIGNS.)

RESOLUTION NO. 27
for 1967


WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 36, Ordinance No. 567, the Street Committee of the Common Council has recommended the erection of stop signs on Ash, Sherman and Vine Streets at their intersection with Tenth Street, requiring the traffic on Ash Street approaching from the east, and on Sherman and Vine Streets approaching from the west side of Tenth Street to stop at said intersection with Tenth Street; and

WHEREAS such regulation is deemed to be reasonable and necessary for the safe movement of traffic in the City of Lebanon,


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Stop signs shall be erected on Ash Street at its intersection with the east side of Tenth Street, and on Sherman and Vine Streets at their respective intersections with the west side of Tenth Street; and Ash Street at its intersection with the east side of Tenth Street is declared to be a stop street, and Sherman Street and Vine Street at their respective intersections with the west side of Tenth Street are declared to be stop streets; and such designations are part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon, Oregon.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 5th day of September, 1967.
