"E" STREET, AND SIXTH STREET AT ITS INTER-
SECTION WITH OAK STREET, AND ON GROVE AT
ITS INTERSECTION WITH OAK STREET, AND
PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION OF SUITABLE
STOP SIGNS.

RESOLUTION NO. 20
for 1972

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5, (5), Ordinance No. 1283, the Street Committee of the Common Council has recommended the erection of stop signs on Sixth Street at its intersection with "E" Street and on Sixth Street at its intersection with Oak Street, and on Grove Street at its intersection with Oak Street; and

WHEREAS, such regulation is deemed to be reasonable and necessary for the safe movement of traffic in the City of Lebanon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL


OF THE CITY OF LEBANON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Stop signs shall be erected on Sixth Street at its intersection with "E" Street and one stop sign shall be erected on Sixth Street at its intersection with Oak Street, and on Grove Street at its intersection with Oak Street, and said Sixth Street is declared to be a stop street on both the North and South sides of "E" Street, and on the South side of Oak Street and Grove Street, ~~and~~ on both the North and South sides of Oak Street; and such designations are part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon, Oregon.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 17 day of October, 1972.
