

A RESOLUTION REGULATING STREET PARKING )  
IN THE CITY OF LEBANON. )

RESOLUTION NO. 3  
for 1977

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5(5), Ordinance No. 1282 (compiled as 6-4.5), the Street Committee of the Common Council has recommended that parking be eliminated on the West side of Fifth Street between Olive Street and the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks, and on the East side of Fifth Street beginning at the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks and extending South 100 feet; and

WHEREAS, such regulation is deemed to be reasonable and necessary for the safe movement of traffic in the City of Lebanon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Parking is hereby prohibited on the West side of Fifth Street between Olive Street and the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks, and on the East side of Fifth Street beginning at the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks and extending South 100 feet; and no parking signs and suitable control markings shall be erected or painted in the appropriate places on said street; and such designations are part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon, Oregon.

Passed by the Council <sup>by a vote of 6 for and 0 against</sup> and approved by the Mayor this 12th day of January, 1977.
