LINDSAY LANE, AND ELEVENTH STREET. )

RESOLUTION NO. 29  
for 1980

WHEREAS, the installment of stop signs are deemed to be reasonable and necessary for the safe movement of traffic in the City of Lebanon at the locations described below:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Stop signs shall be erected on Azalea Street, Lindsay Lane, and Eleventh Street as follows:

- A. A stop sign shall be placed at the northeast corner of Azalea Street and Tenth Street, stopping traffic on Azalea Street as it approaches the intersection.
- B. A stop sign shall be placed at the southwest corner of Lindsay Lane and Tenth Street, stopping traffic on Lindsay Lane as it approaches the intersection.
- C. A stop sign shall be placed at the southwest corner of Eleventh Street and Tenth Street, stopping traffic on Eleventh Street as it approaches the intersection.

Passed by the Council by a vote of 4 for and 0 against and approved by the Mayor this 27<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1980.
