

A RESOLUTION REGULATING STREET )  
PARKING IN THE CITY OF LEBANON )

Resolution No. 19  
for 1981

WHEREAS, the Oregon State Highway Department has reconstructed the Southwest corner of the Oak Street and Main Street intersection to provide a larger turning radius for truck traffic; and

WHEREAS, to give trucks the optimum use of this new radius, parking be eliminated on a portion of Main Street; and

WHEREAS, such regulation is deemed to be reasonable and necessary for the safe movement of traffic in the City of Lebanon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, AS FOLLOWS:


Parking is hereby prohibited along the West side of Main Street for 110 feet measured from the centerline of the Oak Street Right-of-Way Southward.

Suitable signs shall be erected and/or markings painted in appropriate places prohibiting parking; and such designation shall be a part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon, Oregon.

Passed by the Council by a vote of 5 for and 0 against, and approved by the Mayor this 13<sup>th</sup> day of MAY, 1981.
