

A RESOLUTION REQUIRING CONTRACTORS ON THE SOUTH MAIN ROAD PROJECT TO GIVE A HIRING PREFERENCE TO PEOPLE UNEMPLOYED AT LEAST 15 OF THE 26 WEEKS BEFORE MARCH 24, 1983 AND REQUIRING THAT ALL OCD GRANT FUNDS LESS ADMINISTRATION COSTS BY THE CITY OF LEBANON BE USED SOLELY AS DIRECT LABOR COSTS BY THE CONTRACTOR.)

RESOLUTION NO. 15
for 1983

WHEREAS, Oregon Community Development (OCD) funds require stimulus to employment and improvement in unemployment is of vital concern to the City of Lebanon, and the City of Lebanon believes the requirements of this Resolution will benefit the unemployed and the entire community, and

WHEREAS, Linn County and Lebanon in particular has had one of the highest unemployment rates in the state, and

WHEREAS, the construction industry has been one of the hardest hit among employment sectors, and

WHEREAS, the South Main Road project is the most important public works project in the City, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF LEBANON AS FOLLOWS:

1) That no less than forty percent (40%) of the contractor employees on the South Main Road project shall be Linn County residents at the time of their hire;

2) That no less than fifty percent (50%) of the contractor employees hired on the South Main Road project shall have been unemployed at least fifteen (15) of the previous twenty-six (26) weeks prior to March 24, 1983.

Passed by the Council by a vote of 4 for and 0 against and approved by the Mayor this 22nd day of June, 1983.
