A RESOLUTION REGULATING STREET ) PARKING IN THE CITY OF LEBANON. ) RESOLUTION No. 19 for 1983

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has recommended that parking be eliminated on a portion of Oak Street and Fifth Street; and

WHEREAS, such regulation is deemed to be reasonable and necessary for the safe movement of traffic in the City of Lebanon.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON AS FOLLOWS:

Parking is hereby prohibited:

1) along 70 feet of the North side of Oak Street, East of 5th Street; and

2) along 100 feet of the South side of Oak Street, East of 5th Street; and

3) along 80 feet of the South side of Oak Street, West of 5th Street; and

4) along 100 feet of the North side of Oak Street, West of 5th Street; and

5) along 40 feet of the West side of 5th Street, North of Oak Street; and

6) along 40 feet of the East side of 5th Street, North of Oak Street; and

7) along 33 feet of the East side of 5th Street, South of Oak Street; and

8) along 33 feet of the West side of 5th Street, South of Oak Street.

All distances are to be measured from the straight line projection of the curb lines of that particular corner.

All existing Resolutions prohibiting or restricting parking at the Oak Street and Fifth Street intersection are hereby repealed. Suitable signs shall be erected and/or markings may be painted in the appropriate places; and such designation shall be part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon, Oregon.

Passed by the Council by a vote of 6 for and 0 against, and approved by the Mayor this 13 day of July, 1983.
