WHEREAS: Governor Victor Atiyeh has proclaimed that May 4-10 shall be recognized as Oregon "Fire Service Appreciation Week."


WHEREAS: Oregon Fire Service is composed of 3200 paid and 8800 volunteer personnel in over 400 departments, districts, and volunteer companies.

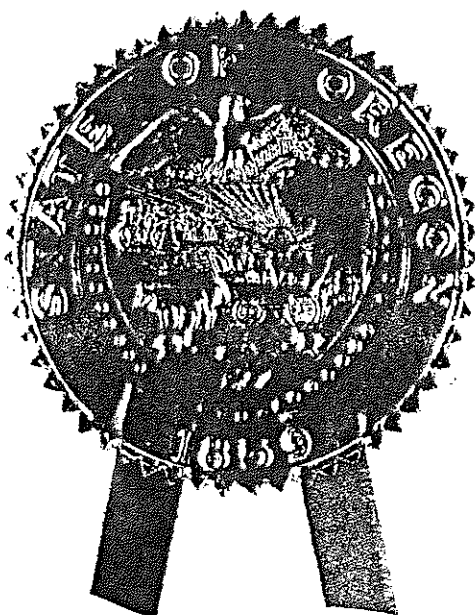

Tower Ladder 351 will be set up for water tower operation. A pictorial display will be assembled explaining the events that lead to obtaining 351, the reconstruction, and the first fire 351 was on.

Sometime during the day an unveiling of special plaques will be made by the Lebanon City Council and the Rural Fire Board. This will be the Department's recognition to the public for their assistance in obtaining funds for the Aerial Scope Apparatus.

LACOMB
