RESOLUTION NO. 40
for 1986

WHEREAS, each year 10,000 Oregonians are seriously injured and 300 more are killed because of drinking and drugged drivers; and

WHEREAS, drinking drivers kill and injure more people each year than all other violent crimes together; and

WHEREAS, traffic accidents are the leading cause of death among young people age 16-24; and

WHEREAS, this senseless carnage on our highways can be reduced through increased awareness of what can be done and a willingness to get involved; and

WHEREAS, the holiday period is a particularly appropriate time to focus national and local attention on this critical problem,

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the City of Lebanon, joins with the United States Congress, the President of the United States, the Governor of Oregon, legislatures, city and town councils, governors, mayors, and other citizens across the Nation, in designating the week of December 14-20, 1986 as "National Drunk and Driving Awareness Week" and December as "Drinking and Drugged Driving Awareness Month in Oregon" in supporting national and local observances thereof, and urge our fellow citizens not to drive under the influence of alcohol nor ride with anyone that does and use and encourage others to use safety belts.
