RESOLUTION NO. 36  
FOR 1987

WHEREAS over half of all fatal and serious injury traffic accidents each year are the result of drinking and drugged drivers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lebanon is aware of the dangers of driving under the influence of chemical substances and has participated in programs attempting to curb this tragic situation; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Lebanon has responded to the need to confront the ill effects of substance abuse through their involvement in community projects; and

WHEREAS, there has been a groundswell of national and local activities aimed at these problems; and

WHEREAS, by working together toward a common goal of fewer alcohol and drug related highway crashes, we may enjoy a safer roadway system,

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of Lebanon joins with the United States Congress, the President of the United States, the Governor of Oregon, legislatures, city and town councils, governors, mayors, and other citizens across the nation in designating December, 1987 as "Drinking and Drugged Driving Awareness Month in Oregon" and the week of December 13-19, 1987 as "National Drunk and Drugged Driving Week" and in supporting national and local observances thereof, and urge our fellow citizens not to drive under the influence of intoxicants,

use and encourage others to use safety belts, and drive with respect for others.

Passed by the City Council by a vote of 6 for and 0 against and approved by the Mayor this 9<sup>th</sup> day of December 1987.
