RESOLUTION NO. 29  
for 1993

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed a request from citizens to add stop signs on South Main Road at Market Street in the City of Lebanon; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer, after performing a traffic analysis according to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, determined that adding stop signs on South Main Road at Market Street is not warranted according to the guidelines published by said manual; and


WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that extenuating circumstances exist which justify the installation of stop signs on South Main Road, those circumstances including the vehicular and pedestrian safety of the senior citizens in the area; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. Stop signs and pedestrian crosswalks will be installed on South Main Road to regulate northbound and southbound traffic at the intersection with Market Street; and

Section 2. Suitable signs shall be erected in the appropriate places; and such designation shall be part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon, Oregon.
