RESOLUTION NO. <u>44</u> FOR 2000

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon has determined that it is desirable to seek voter approval of a five year local option law enforcement operating levy at a rate of \$0.6819 per \$1000 assessed value for a period of five years commencing July 1, 2000 and ending June 30, 2005.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, LINN COUNTY, OREGON AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That an election is hereby called for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the City the question of authorizing a five year local option law enforcement operating levy at a rate of \$0.6819 per \$1000 of assessed value for a period of five years commencing July 1, 2000 and ending June 30, 2005. It is estimated the total amount to be received from such local option levy during the five year period is \$1,656,865.
- 2. That the election hereby called shall be held on the 16th day of May, 2000.
- 3. That the City directs that there shall be delivered to the election officer of Linn County, Oregon not later than the 61st day before the date of the election the Notice of Measure Election attached hereto, with such changes consistent with the intent of this resolution as are approved by the Mayor and the City Administrator Pro Tem.
- 4. That the County Clerk shall cause the Notice of Measure Election and sample ballot to be posted and published in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon.
- 5. Pursuant to ORS 310.145, the five year law enforcement local option operating levy at a rate of \$0.6819 per \$1,000 of assessed property value shall be classified as being subject to the limits of section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and that the revenues will be used for government purposes other than education, specifically law enforcement purposes.
