ON 5<sup>TH</sup> STREET AT MARY STREET )

RESOLUTION NO. 35  
for 2002

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed a request from citizens to add stop signs on 5<sup>th</sup> Street at Mary Street in the City of Lebanon; and,

WHEREAS, the City Engineer, after performing a traffic analysis according to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, determined that adding stop signs on 5<sup>th</sup> Street at Mary Street is not warranted; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that extenuating circumstances exist which justify the installation of stop signs on 5<sup>th</sup> Street, those circumstances including the pedestrian safety of children in the area;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON  
AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Stop signs will be installed on 5<sup>th</sup> Street to regulate northbound and southbound traffic at the intersection with Mary Street; and,


Section 2. Suitable signs shall be installed and/or markings painted and such designation shall be part of the traffic regulations of the City of Lebanon.

This Resolution supersedes and replaces conflicting portions of previous Resolutions governing traffic control devices at this location.

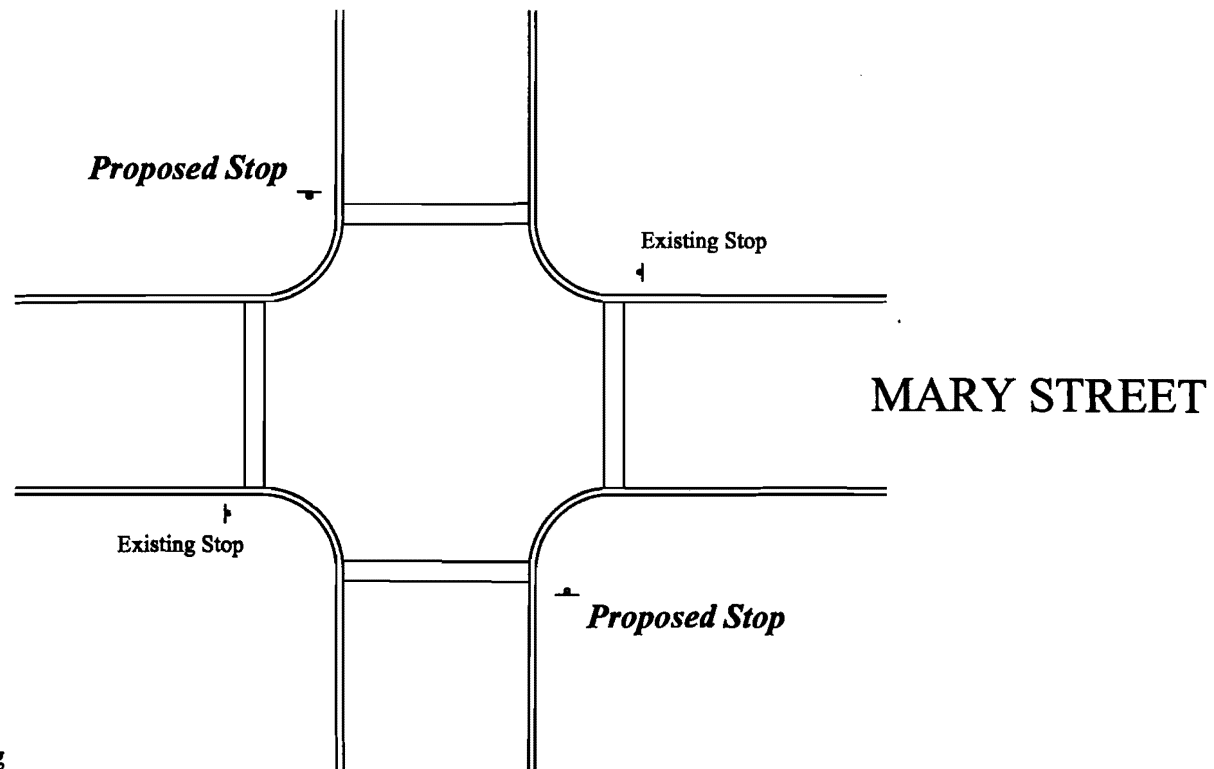
