**WHEREAS**, the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department is accepting applications for the Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Lebanon desires to participate in this grant program to the greatest extent possible as a means of providing needed park and recreation acquisitions, improvements and enhancements; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council, the Parks Advisory Committee, the Parks Master Plan and the Lebanon Strategic Trails Plan has identified the need to develop an interconnected trail system; and

**WHEREAS**, the applicant hereby certifies that the matching share for this application is readily available at this time.


**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEBANON CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** The City of Lebanon is authorized to apply for a Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant from the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department for the development of a trail couplet (Exhibit A), connecting the Cheadle Lake North Shore Trail with Weirich Drive as described in the Lebanon Strategic Trails Plan.

**Section 2.** This resolution is effective immediately upon passage.

# CHEADLE LAKE North Trail Couplet Vicinity Map

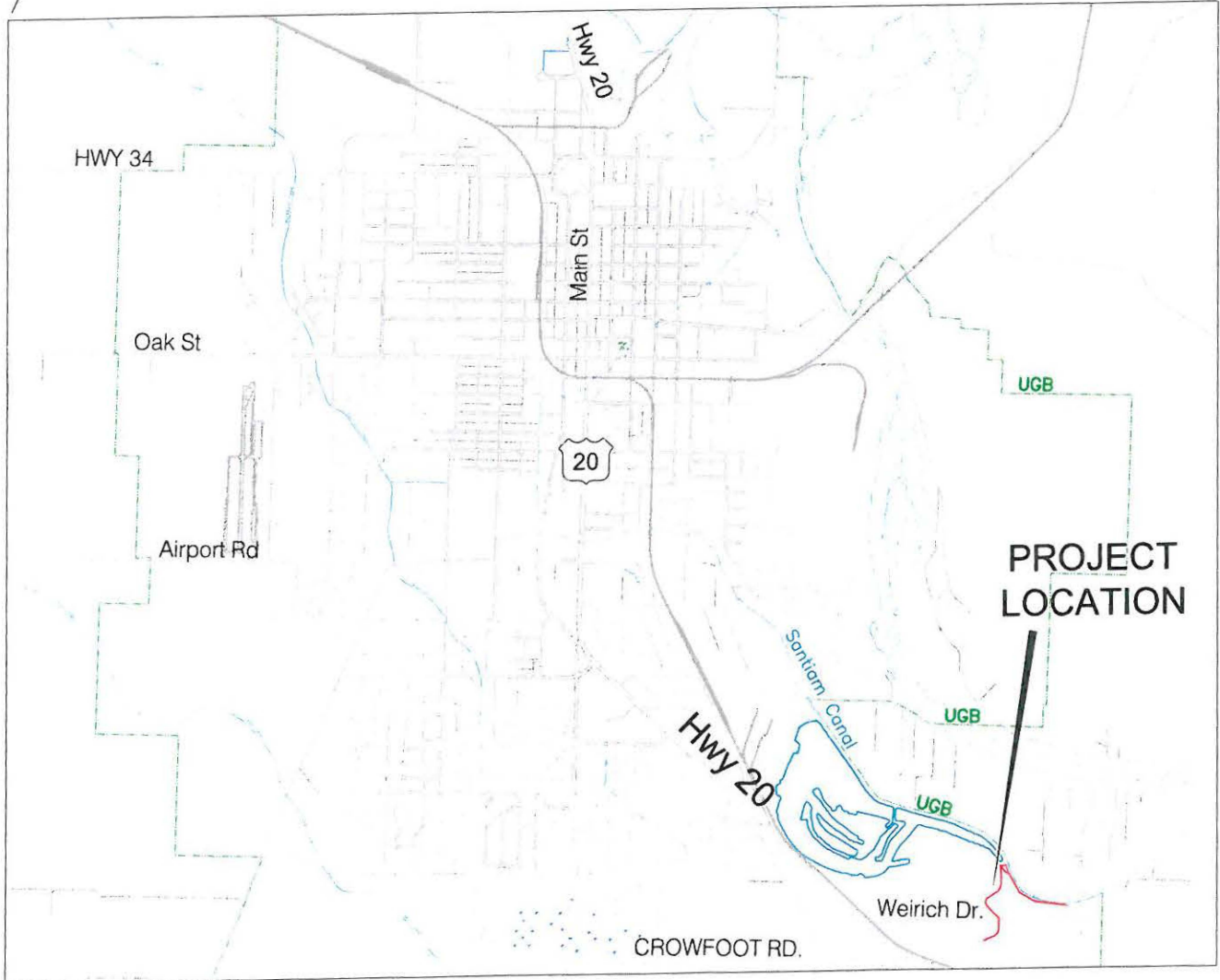
