

## Ordinance No. 69.

An Ordinance requiring all persons hereafter confined in the City Jail of the City of Lebanon, Linn County Oregon, upon conviction of the violation of any Ordinance of said City of Lebanon, to work upon the public Streets and Squares of said City, and providing for the close confinement of such person on a diet of bread and water as may refuse so to work.

The People of the City of Lebanon do ordain as follows:

## Section 1.

All persons hereafter confined in the City Jail of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, upon conviction of the violation of any Ordinance of the said City of Lebanon, are hereby required to work upon the public Streets and Squares of said City between the hours of 8 O'clock A.M. and noon, and 1 O'clock P.M. and 5 P.M. of each and every day during the period of confinement therein, under the control, direction and supervision of the City Marshal of said City.

## Section 2.

Any person so confined, who shall refuse to work as in the preceding section required, when able so to do, shall be kept in close confinement in the City Jail and be fed only upon bread and water, during the remainder of his or her sentence.

## Section 3.

The Recorder of the City of Lebanon aforesaid, at the time of the conviction of any person of the violation of any Ordinance of said City or at any time during the sentence of any such person, may in his discretion, for good cause shown, relieve any such person from

the necessity of performing the whole or any part of the work provided for in Section one of this Ordinance, by an order endorsed upon the commitment of any such person.

Section 4.

It is hereby made the duty of the City Marshal to see that the provisions of this Ordinance are carried out in accordance herewith.

Section 5.

This Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.

Passed and enacted by the City Council on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of January 1907.
