

Ordinance No. 71.

An ordinance to tax license and regulate Billiard tables, Pool tables and combination Billiard-Pool Tables, providing the time when the places where same are used, shall be closed, and to prevent the playing of Cards or Card games in Billiard and Pool rooms and other places, and to prevent Minors, Women and girls being in Pool and Billiard rooms, and to punish any violation of this ordinance.

The People of Lebanon do Ordain as follows
Section One (I)

Billiard table, Pool table or combination Billiard-Pool table,

That the owner, proprietor or keeper of any Billiard table, Pool table or combination Billiard-Pool table, kept for profit or for which any compensation is had or asked for the playing of any such games on any such tables within the City of Lebanon, Silver County Oregon. Shall pay a license of \$25.00 for each table for twelve months or \$15.00 for six months for each table, and no license shall be issued for a shorter period than six months, nor longer than twelve months, and shall procure therefor, before such tables or any of them are used in said City of Lebanon, a license from the Recorder of said City, and pay to the Treasurer the fee required hereby, in the manner required by the ordinances of said City for procuring licenses.

Section II.

It shall be unlawful for the owner, proprietor or keeper of any Billiard Table, Pool Table or combination Billiard-Pool table or Tables to conduct, run or use or allow the same to be conducted, run or used within the City of Lebanon, without first having procured a license therefor as herein provided and without first having paid the license fee as herein provided, and any person or persons firm or Corporation violating any of the provisions of

Ordinance, shall upon conviction before the Recorder's Court of the City of Lebanon be punished by fine not exceeding \$100.⁰⁰ nor less than \$25.⁰⁰ or by imprisonment not more than 50 days nor less than 12 days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Section III.

That no minor or minors, women or girls shall be allowed to frequent, loiter about or be in any room or rooms or place when any Billiards or Pools or Billiard-Pools are being played or when such tables are kept for playing for profit; and no minor or minors, or women or girls shall be permitted or allowed to play any Billiards or Pools or combination Billiards-Pools in any such place.

Section IV

That it shall be unlawful within the City of Lebanon Oregon, for any one to deal, play or carry on open or cause to be played carried on or opened, or who shall conduct either as owner, proprietor, or employe whether for him or not, in any place when any goods, wares, merchandise are sold or offered for sale, or when any Candies, nuts, confectionery or drinks of any kind are sold or offered for sale, or when any billiards or Pools are played or when any Billiard or pool tables or Combination ^{Billiard} Pool Tables are kept for use or playing for hire or profit, any game of of faro, Monte, roulette, roque et noir, languanet, rondo. Twenty one, poker, draw poker, brag, bluff, draw or any kind of banking, or any Pedro, seven up, whist Carbage, euchre or any other game played with cards, dice, or any other device whether the same be played for money, checks, credits

or any other representative of value, or for pleasure, and any person or persons violating any of the provisions hereby, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court shall be punished by fine not exceeding \$100.⁰⁰ or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding 50 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section V.

That all rooms or places where any Billiards, Pools or Combination Billiard-Pools are played or where such Tables are used or kept for use for profit, shall be closed and kept closed from 11 O'Clock at night until five O'Clock the following morning, of week days, and from 11 O'Clock at night on Saturday nights until five O'Clock on the following Monday morning.

Section VI.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this herewith are hereby repealed.

Section VII.

In as much as the City of Lebanon has no ordinance on the subject of playing Cards and Billiards and the City is in great need of the revenue derived therefrom and that the peace and quiet of the City is in danger, an Emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
