An Ordinance vacating a part of the Street called Third Street lying and being between Sherman Street and Grant Street and adjacent to the right of way of Oregon & California Railroad Company, in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon.

The People of the City of Lebanon do Ordain as follows

Section 1- That the following described portion of the Street called Third Street lying and being between Grant Street and Sherman Street be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the South line of Sherman Street with the East line of Oregon & California Railroad Company's right of way, thence East along the said South line of Sherman Street 37 feet; thence South on a line parallel with and 37 feet Eastwardly from the said East line of the said Right of way a distance of 264 feet to the North line of Grant Street; thence West 37 feet to the East line of the

said Right-of-way of the Oregon & California Railroad Company, thence North along the East line of said Right-of-way 264 feet to the place of beginning.

Section 2 - This portion of the said Street is vacated for the purpose of enabling the Oregon & California Railroad Company, its successors or lessees to construct and maintain a combined freight and passenger depot thereon, and is conditioned that no railroad track shall be located on the east side of the said Depot building.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after thirty days from and after its passage by the Council and Approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council this 13th day of April, 1908.
